

# CUSTOMFLEX<sup>®</sup> ARTIFICIALIRIS: Photo of the Month

February 2021



This is a case of an 18 y.o. male who sustained a penetrating trauma resulting in a globe rupture of his right eye with expulsion of the crystalline lens, large corneal laceration and 90% loss of iris tissue. The patient was aphakic as a result of the trauma with significant iris defects, fibrosis and necrosis of the residual iris as well as corneal scarring. 10 months after his globe rupture repair, the patient underwent a secondary scleral-fixated PCIOL placement and a scleral-fixated CUSTOMFLEX<sup>®</sup> ARTIFICIALIRIS. The patient's uncorrected vision is now 20/30+2. His sensory exotropia and difficulty with depth perception have now resolved.
